## **DESERT SPRINGS CANCER CARE CENTER ANNOUNCES OPEN HOUSE FUNDRAISING EVENT FOR AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY**

Desert Springs Cancer Care Center, the first medical oncology practice located north of Loop 101 in Scottsdale and the first green-built facility in Arizona, is pleased to announce the grand opening of its facility with a special open house event to raise funds for the American Cancer Society. The event, which will be held on Thursday, February 25 from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. and will include light food and beverages, is open to members of the community, local doctors and current/prospective patients. Desert Springs Cancer Care Center is located on the northeast corner of Scottsdale and Deer Valley Roads. The address is 21803 N. Scottsdale Road in Scottsdale. The event is free but donations are welcome.

During the event, owners Drs. Andrew Buresh and Lesley Meng will offer information and tours of the 5,000 square-foot clinic, where guest can learn about the facility's services including medical oncology and hematology consultation, chemotherapy and all therapeutic infusions, and on-site pharmacy and laboratory. In addition to traditional services, Drs. Buresh and Meng will also introduce and demonstrate some of the innovative practices available at their clinic including lymphedema therapy, organic manicures and pedicures, classes on patient nutrition and skin care, yoga for chemotherapy patients and their families, on-site wig and prosthetic services and a boutique with vitamins, jewelry, fashion, make-up and more.

In addition to donations, the event will also hold a fundraising raffle to benefit the American Cancer Society. Prizes include organic manicures, organic pedicures, gourmet dinners, yoga instruction, golf outings, massages and other luxury services.

“We modeled our clinic and patient service philosophy after the Four Seasons rather than a traditional medical practice,” said Buresh, who is also a published researcher in the cancer field. “Our goal is simple – to treat patients the same way we would want one of our family members to be treated.”

In addition to a patient service-focused philosophy, the facility includes several sustainable properties including automatic lighting and CFLs, tinted and shaded windows, low water usage plumbing and 100% copper piping, low odor/zero VOC paint and more, making it the first green facility in Arizona.

“Taking advantage of an abundance of natural lighting and outstanding views, we harmoniously blend our outdoor and indoor environments to create a setting that is peaceful and tranquil, in order to relieve stress and tension the minute one walks through the door,” said Meng, who was recently named one of the top oncologists in America.
